



Alfred Station Fire Company attends Cub Scout Day Camp

Members of the Alfred Station Fire Company were invited to attend Cub Scout Day Camp at the Kanakadea Park in North Hornell. At each point, the Cub Scouts were able to try their hand at some of the equipment, including the personal protective equipment (turnout gear), indian tanks (portable grass fire pumps, and the company's thermal imaging camera. This day camp is hosted by the Five Rivers Boy Scout Council and was directed by Mary Stearns of Alfred Station. The Alfred Station Fire Company was happy to share the day with the camp's 62 Cub Scouts in continuance of their various fire prevention programs.

In other business, the Alfred Station Fire Company responded to 10 calls in the month of July: six automatic fire alarms - four of which were on the Alfred University Campus, and one each at Rose Apartments and the Ceramic Corridor facility respectively, two motor vehicle accidents, one mutual aid call with Almond Fire Company and one call for assistance in finding a missing child. At press time the Alfred Station's year to date emergency call total is 102 calls. This total reflects a major increase compared to last year's recording setting total of 100 calls for the entire year.
